

McKinlay Shire is the Gateway to the Gulf and spans 41,000 square kilometres. With 880 residents, the McKinlay Shire supports industries including cattle, sheep, mining and tourism.

The Julia Creek Caravan Park Managers will be responsible for the day-to-day operations of the Park under the guidance of Council's Community Services Team Leader. Council is responsible for all ongoing operational costs, repairs and

maintenance while providing an exceptional remuneration package which includes a fully furnished 3 bedroom Manager's residence with electricity, home phone and internet provided. The Managers will also be provided with Council cleaners during the peak-season (April to September) for assistance with cleaning of cabins and rooms as required and Council staff can provide some administrative assistance when needed.

Julia Creek Caravan Park provides a wide range of accommodation and unique experiences for travelling guests to indulge in a truly authentic Outback Queensland experience.

The Park offers guests 24 powered drive-through sites, large grass areas for powered and unpowered camping, 5 self contained cabins (2 x 6-berth and 3 x 4-berth) and 4 twin share cabins with communal bathroom facilities. The Park is situated within walking distance to the centre of town and Julia Creek Visitor Information Centre.

Council has also heavily invested in a wide range of infrastructure tailored to provide guests with a magnificent stay which include 6 Artesian Bathhouses (2 bathtubs in each), 2 amenities blocks, free Wi-Fi, a large camp kitchen and Monday night Bush Dinners where local not-for-profit organisations provide dinner and desert for up to 150 guests each week during peak season. The Manager's are responsible for cleaning of the aforementioned facilities, however additional money has been added to the Manager's wage to allow them to seek the possibility of employing individuals from within the local area.

During the peak season, the Park can host between 150 and 250 guests per week which is largely dependant on weather conditions (winter months are more popular due to the often harsh climate faced during warmer months). Council utilises the RMS booking system and previous experience with the program would be extremely beneficial however Council is able to arrange training if required.

The Julia Creek Caravan Park is a wonderful facility that provides amazing experiences for visitors and staff alike. As soon as you drive in, you'll feel right at home. There are 'No strangers here, just friends you haven't yet met'.
