Part 1 Preliminary

1 Short title

This subordinate local law may be cited as Subordinate Local Law No. 4 (Local Government Controlled Areas, Facilities and Roads) 2019.

2 Purpose and how it is to be achieved

- (1) The purpose of this subordinate local law is to supplement *Local Law No.4 (Local Government Controlled Areas, Facilities and Roads) 2019* in order to protect the health and safety of persons using local government controlled land, facilities, infrastructure and roads and preserve features of the natural and built environment and other aspects of the amenity of local government controlled land, facilities, infrastructure and roads.
- (2) The purpose is to be achieved by providing for—
 - (a) the regulation of access to local government controlled areas; and
 - (b) the prohibition or restriction of particular activities in local government controlled areas or roads.
 - (c) minimum standards for fences on land adjoining a road.

3 Authorising local law

The making of the provisions in this subordinate local law is authorised by *Local Law No.4 (Local Government Controlled Areas, Facilities and Roads) 2019* (the *authorising local law*).

4 Definitions

Particular words used in this subordinate local law have the same meaning as provided for in the authorising local law.

Part 2 Use of local government controlled areas, facilities and roads

5 Prohibited and restricted activities—Authorising local law, s 5(1)

- (1) For section 5(1)(a) of the authorising local law, the activities prescribed in column 2 of schedule 1 are declared to be prohibited in the corresponding local government controlled area or road (or part thereof) mentioned in column 1 of schedule 1.
- (2) For section 5(1)(b) of the authorising local law, the activities prescribed in column 2 of schedule 2 are declared to be restricted in the corresponding local government controlled area or road (or part thereof) mentioned in column 1 of schedule 2, to the extent described in column 3 of schedule 2.

6 Motor vehicle access in local government controlled areas—Authorising local law, s 6(1)(b)

For section 6(1)(b) of the authorising local law, the areas prescribed in column 1 of schedule 3 are declared to be motor vehicle access areas.

7 Prohibited vehicles—Authorising local law, s 6(3)

For section 6(3) of the authorising local law, the specific types of motor vehicle prescribed in column 2 of schedule 3 are declared to be prohibited vehicles in the corresponding specified motor vehicle access area in column 1 of schedule 3.

8 Opening hours for local government controlled areas—Authorising local law, s 7(1)

For section 7(1) of the authorising local law, the times prescribed in column 2 of schedule 4 are declared to be the opening hours for the local government controlled areas mentioned in column 1 of schedule 4.

9 Permanent closure of local government controlled area—Authorising local law, s 8(3)

For section 8(3) of the authorising local law, the local government controlled areas described in schedule 5 are permanently closed to public access.

Part 3 Matters affecting roads

10 Notice requiring owner of land adjoining road to fence land—Authorising local law, s 9(3)

For section 9(3) of the authorising local law, the minimum standards for a fence that is the subject of a compliance notice under section 9(2) of the authorising local law are as follows—

- (a) the fence must be constructed of materials which are of sufficient strength to—
 - (i) restrain the types of animals to be contained in the area adjacent to the fence; and
 - (ii) stop the animals from escaping over, under or through the fence; and
- (b) the height of the fence must be sufficient to restrain the types of animals to be contained in the area adjacent to the fence from jumping or climbing over the fence; and
- (c) if an animal to be contained in the area adjacent to the fence has the ability to dig the fence must include a barrier installed directly below the fence to prevent the animal digging its way underneath the fence; and
- (d) if the fence includes a gate the gate must be kept closed and latched

except when in immediate use by a person entering or leaving the area adjacent to the fence.



		causes a risk to the safety of others.

		(n) Fouling, polluting or littering.
		(o) Entering, or remaining in, the pool facility when in a state of intoxication or under the influence of alcohol or any drug whatsoever.
		(p) Interfering with any life-saving equipment or behaving in a manner which disrupts the provision of life saving services.
		(q) If a person is more than five years of age — entering any part of the swimming pool, including any facility at the swimming pool, which is set apart for the exclusive use of the opposite sex, other than for the purpose of rendering emergency assistance.
9	All aerodromes and helipads	(a) Entering any part of the aerodrome or helipad that has been closed to public access by an authorised person.
		(b) Engaging in conduct that—
		(i) could cause annoyance, disturbance or offence to a person; or
		(ii) could obstruct or unreasonably interfere with the rights of use of a person; or
		(iii)creates a risk to the safety of others.
		(c) Using any facility other than for the purpose, and in the manner for which, the facility was designed.
10	All caravan parks	(a) Reside or carry out domestic tasks in a caravan that, in the opinion of an authorised person, is dilapidated, unsightly, overcrowded or unfit for use.



		(b) Lighting or maintaining a fire in the open air except in a designated fire place provided by the local government.
		(c) Display or exhibit advertising matter.
		(d) Park a caravan or erect a tent in a place that is not allocated by the manager of the caravan park.
		(e) Let or hire a caravan, cabin or tent to another person without written local government approval.
		(f) Take or bring an animal other than a cat or dog.
		(g) Use hand washing facilities for purposes other than their intended use.
		(h) Lay down floor covering on the ground surface.
		(i) Injure, destroy or remove a tree, shrub or plant.
		(j) Dig a hole or trench.
		(k) Engage in an unlawful business, trade or occupation.
11	All bridges and culverts	(a) Drive a vehicle on the bridge or culvert if the combined weight of the vehicle exceeds the load limit for the bridge or culvert.
		(b) Loiter on the bridge or culvert.
		(c) Dive or jump from the bridge or culvert.
		(d) Throw or drop an object from the bridge or culvert.
		(e) Obstruct or interfere with the bridge or culvert.
12	All rivers, creeks and public dams	(a) Disobeying a lawful direction to leave the area.

		(g) Using aquatic equipment in a manner that, in the opinion of an authorised person, causes a risk to the safety of others.
		(h) Bringing, in the opinion of an authorised person, dangerous aquatic equipment or things onto the area.
13	All showgrounds, rodeo and equestrian facilities	(a) Knowingly introducing a communicable sickness or diseased animal onto the area.
		(b) Lighting or maintaining a fire that is not in a designated fire place provided by the local government.
