6.2 Provision of Factory Baits to Rural Property Owners

This report makes recommendation to Council for the provision of Sodium fluoroacetate (1080) factory baits free of charge, with limitations to rural property owners.

The provision of baits is based on property owners who have been levied for the Feral Pest Animal charge as part of their rates and who do not participate in the aerial baiting program.

Council commenced the levying of rural property owners in the 2015/16 financial year to assist in the funding of the ongoing management of the feral pest management program, specifically for the management of Wild Dog and Feral Pigs. The levy is applied to rural property owners with lots of 1000 Ha or greater and based on a rate per Ha. The levy is expected to achieve revenue of about \$40K this financial year. Council also contributes a similar value of general revenue and also seeks funding from grants and the like as the opportunity arises.

Council should note that the application of the levy is not to specifically fund the aerial baiting program but feral pest animal management program in general.

Council has also received a request to provide the factory baits at a reduced cost or free of charge to all rural land owners.

Council provides a service to rural land owners for the provision of various factory baits at cost; these include both Wild Dog and Feral Pig baits. The supply of these baits is regulated by state legislation. This includes specific requirements relating to strict controls of use regarding ownership of the lands, uses of baits to

specific properties. Council should note that Local Authorities are the only agencies authorised to sell Sodium fluoroacetate (1080) factory baits. Further, these baits are only to be used in the McKinlay Shire and not outside the shire boundaries.

From 2008, Council has provided various types of Sodium fluoroacetate (1080) factory baits. The total baits sold have ranged from 2000 and up to 4000 plus per annum. For the past 2 years the product has been sold at cost.

Options:

The following options have been considered by Council, being:

- 1. The subsidising of factory baits at a rate between 25 and 50% to all rural property owners. Noting that this is expected to equate to a cost of up to \$5 k per annum based on past trends; and
- 2. The provision of factory baits free of charge to those property owners who do not participate in the aerial program. With the limit of subsidy being to the total value of their respective levy. It is difficult to provide an estimated cost to Council for this option but would expect that it to be at a minimum, a similar cost of the about and up to say \$10k. Noting that those who participate in the aerial baiting will not be eligible for the subsidised factory bait.

Following discussions with Council the preferred option was established as the provision of factory baits free of charge to those property owners who do not participate in the aerial baiting.

- 1. The Factory Bait is provided free of charge up to the value levied in their particular assessment (property); and
- 2. The property owners must not participate in aerial baiting for the financial year; and
- 3. The property owner must sign a declaration that they will not participate in aerial baiting;

The land is zoned rural under the shire planning scheme and there are no council services connected or charged to the property.

9.2 Request to Write Off Debtor Account

The Julia Creek Dirt n Dust Committee previously wrote to Council requesting that Council write off the existing lease debt or consider a significant reduction and also consider reviewing the current MOU and a reduction in lease payments.

In light of this request a report was table to Council in the July Ordinary Council meeting with the above requests.

The following resolution was passed at this meeting;

- 2. The request to renegotiate a reduction in the annual lease payments currently set at \$6,700 per annum for Lot 1 SP25061, Lot 2 EN148, Lot 17 EN154 and Lot 6 JC55713.

Council resolves to seek input via community survey to inform their decision.

In line with the resolution a community survey was drafted and forwarded to the Dirt and Dust Committee for their input.

Council then received correspondence from the Dirt and Dust Committee advising that they would pay the outstanding debt, but would still like to enter in discussions regarding the MOU and a reduction in lease payments.

Since there was no survey sent out due to Dirt and Dust Committee advising that they were going to pay the outstanding amount, Councillor's made a decision to ring ratepayers throughout the community so as to gain an insight as to the community expectations.

With the results of some 70 phones calls completed from the Councillors, which is still ongoing, Council discussed the current MOU agreement and lease payments at the August briefing session and a unanimous decision was made to have a report tabled at the next Ordinary Meeting with a recommendation to enter into discussions with regards to the current MOU and to reduce the lease payment from \$6,700 pa to \$2000 pa.
